One recently asked question was; "How do we celebrate a festive holiday when Israel is fighting a war for survival?" At least one answer is; "When are the Jews not fighting for survival?" In our Pesach Haggadah, it states, "In every generation one arises that would destroy Israel." So now, we look to Pesach, which is only a few weeks from now. I am reminded of the documentary "The Gefilte Fish Chronicles". Every Jewish person should see that film at least once. It is in our DNA to cycle through the year with Jewish holidays. They are the stops along life's way. I spoke with our Sunday school students recently about their family trees. The idea was this. Knowledge of our parents, grandparents and beyond helps us to understand who we are. We share not only genes, but in many ways, we are much like our forebears. We undeniably have various traits that are easily identifiable with those of our family. In a similar sense, Jewish holidays help us to understand who we are and who we should strive to be as a people. Pesach is the most widely observed holiday in our calendar for a reason. It defines who we are as a people. We were slaves in Egypt and God took us out with a mighty hand to be a treasured, holy people. God gave us His Torah and told us that it is the blue print for correct living. God did this because he promised Abraham, Isaac and Jacob that He would do so. Therefore, now we know who our collective ancestors were. We begin to understand where some of our personality traits derive. Perhaps more importantly, we begin to understand our great responsibility as a people. We are, to some degree, God's representatives on earth. We also have the added responsibility of living up to the standard set by our ancestors. As we prepare for Pesach and as we enact the Seder yet again, let us have in mind the great and wonderful relationship we have with the past. We hope that we as a people honor our parents, grandparents and ancestors with our actions and our lives.

G. RENTAL OF CONGREGATION SINAL

POLICY: Congregation Sinai may be rented to both members and non-members for a variety of functions. Those functions include Celebration of Life Memorial Services, Funerals, Weddings, and B'nai Mitzvot. Use of the Sanctuary would be available if the Synagogue calendar is open on the requested day.

The Social Hall may be rented for a small reception following a Celebration of Life Memorial Service. The reception will take the place of a Shiva reception in the home and can be for no more than 100 guests. Menu for the reception will be determined by the Committee and mourning family and with the permission of the Ritual Chairperson.

PROCEDURE: The following charges will be in effect for the use of Congregation Sinai:




